Big Question:

• Why is it important to remember WW1, and what effect does remembering and recognizing the past have on NZ future?

Learning Intentions (Students will):

- Understand the role patriotism plays in enlisting for war
- Critically reflect on the pro's and cons of war and what effect it has on the future for the countries involved.

Success Criteria (Students can):

- Share key ideas about the role of patriotism in war
- · Share ideas about the effect war has on the future
- Present model and explain the Gallipoli story
- Explain reasons for enlisting

Vocabulary: enlist, colony, dominion, embarkation, reputation, historian, conscription, ballot

Tuning in: (How to connect with students' current thinking, prior knowledge, misconceptions, interests and wonderings)-

Class discussion -

What is war? Why do we need to have wars? Do they make a difference to the future?

Group Activity:

- Make poster illustrating the reasons men went to war.
- Make a model of the landing at Gallipoli

Other activities/group research:

- If the call came to enlist, would you? Write a letter to your mother, explaining your decision.
- If you decided that you didn't want to enlist, how would you justify your decision to all your friends you did enlist?
- Write a poem to describe the duty and patriotism felt by soldiers.
- Design a stamp to acknowledge contribution by women to WW1.
- Indicate on a world map, the "central Powers" and the "Allies" of WW1

Making conclusions:

- Have you come to a conclusion on how war affects the future?
- Does your poster clearly illustrate reasons for going to war?
